Frederick M. Herrmann, Executive Director of the Election Law Enforcement Commission, announced today that candidates for the State Senate and the General Assembly have reportedly raised \$1,211,933 and spent \$504,907 for their primary election campaigns.

"Financial activity by these candidates as a whole has seen a decrease since 1987, the last time both the Senate and Assembly were up for election," said Herrmann. In 1987, Senate and Assembly candidates raised \$1,460,132 and spent \$574,772, so that 1991 receipts decreased by 17 percent and expenditures decreased by 12 percent. Though the new reports are not completely reviewed at this time, the figures provide a good picture of financial activity in the preelection setting.

"Although it is speculative, the decrease could be attributable to the current economic downturn," said Herrmann. "It is probably more difficult to bring in contributions in 1991 than in 1987."

Herrmann stated that 1991 candidates for the Assembly raised \$717,142 and spent \$306,572 compared with 1987 when Assembly candidates reported \$704,786 in receipts and \$277,390 in expenditures. "Interestingly enough, campaign fundraising and spending by Assembly candidates increased by 2 percent and 11 percent respectively."

Senate candidates raised \$494,791 and spent \$198,334 according to Herrmann. These figures represent a 35 percent decrease in receipts from 1987 and a 33 percent decrease in expenditures. In 1987, the Senate raised \$755,346 and spent \$297,382.

Democrats so far have raised and spent more money in 1991 than Republicans. The Democrats raised \$625,208 and the Republicans raised \$586,725. The Democrats spent \$271,962 and the Republicans spent \$232,945.

In 1987, Herrmann said that Republicans spent more than Democrats, while both parties raised amounts which fell into the \$700,000 range. The Democrats raised \$732,918 and the Republicans raised \$727,214. The Democrats spent only \$243,040 to the \$331,732 spent by Republicans.

Comparing 1991 to 1987, the Democrats raised 15 percent less in 1991 but spent 12 percent more. The Republicans raised 19 percent less and spent 30 percent less in 1991.

"Incumbents continue to enjoy an advantage over challengers," said Herrmann. The statistics indicate that incumbents have raised 82 percent of the total funds collected and spent 78 percent of them. Incumbents raised \$993,752 and spent \$392,282 in 1991. These figures are up from the 1987 primary period when incumbents raised \$982,199 and spent \$319,917. Incumbent fundraising is, accordingly, up 1 percent and spending is up 23 percent.

The fundraising and spending profile of challengers is more bleak in 1991 than it was in 1987. In 1991, challengers raised \$218,181 compared with \$477,932 raised in 1987. Challengers spent \$112,625 in 1991 compared with \$254,855 four years earlier.

Consequently, in 1991, challengers raised only 18 percent of the total funds raised and spent only 22 percent.

Despite the decrease in dollars raised and spent in the 1991 primary election, the number of candidates filing with the Commission rose. In 1991, there are 280 candidates in the legislative races versus 263 in 1987. This increase in numbers may be related to the recent redistricting.

This press release is a compilation of figures reported to the Commission on statistical information sheets submitted as part of the 29-day preelection report. The data is in rough format and may be subject to change after the reports are more fully reviewed. It should be noted that the Commission has the ability to arrange the data in various other formats upon request.

Only those statistical information sheets submitted by 5:00 p.m. on May 13th are a part of this release. If a candidate or treasurer failed to submit a statistical information sheet, the staff of ELEC used the report filed by 5:00 p.m. on May 13th to determine financial activity.

Although the Commission has taken all reasonable precautions to prevent mathematical or typographical errors, the possibility that some exist cannot be entirely eliminated. Copies of any report on file with the Commission are available for inspection during regular office hours.

Also, please be reminded that candidates and committees may transfer funds among each other. Although these transfers are counted in ELEC's statistics as receipts and expenditures, they are not transactions which create new funds. Nevertheless, ELEC's figures create a useful indicator of overall fundraising and spending in the 1991 Primary Election.
